CLUB PRESIDENT• PETER WILLIAMS

I'm writing this from the Mornington Peninsula, south of Melbourne, where I'm on a six course trip among some of the best golfing country in the world. We're a group of 12 with a handicap range from scratch to 13 but anybody who can score more than 30 points on any given day is a good bet to be on the prize list – we're paying out for the top four each day.

What the experience here does show is that you do not need excessive length to make a golf course challenging. For example we played at Cape Schanck (is that the worst name ever for a golf course?) which was only 5281 metres from the blue tees, yet none of us scored 36 points. A combination of well-designed greens with challenging approaches and surrounds, and demanding bunkers, makes golf in this country a lot more difficult than in New Zealand. It's quite probably one reason Australia produces far more topquality professional players per capita than New Zealand does. You have to be a consistent shot maker in this country to score well. At Cromwell we're fortunate that our course is a good challenge because of the greens and surrounds and while we'll be taking some trees out soon, and planting some new ones, the number of trees on a golf course does not have a major impact on how most people score. More of your golf is played around and on the greens than anywhere else so having well designed and maintained greens and surrounds will always be a top priority.

One of my colleagues on this trip is Terry Carr, currently chairman of the board at Wanaka GC. It's been good to talk with him about the issues facing our two clubs but we've agreed that both Cromwell and Wanaka should first and foremost be members clubs. That means members should always have playing priority over non-members and while we like green fee income (which is getting healthier every year) and we're happy to host some charity and competitive events, the playing calendar will always be compiled with the wishes of the members as the most important. You might think that while this is an obvious statement to make, you may like to talk on this subject with some club members not too far from us down the Kawarau Gorge.

There has been a bit of discussion recently about raffles on men's competition days on Wednesday and Saturday. Our previous raffle convenors Gary Pankhurst and Gerry Conlan have stepped down after many years of fantastic service and for the moment Dougall Weilly and me have started running Wednesday with Jeff Tamblyn and Jeff Swale doing Saturday. But if anyone has a desire to be an occasional operator of the raffles please let me know and maybe we can start a roster. By the way, for the sake of convenience and after some pushback against the price increase, we've reverted to \$2 a ticket. We have quite a stock of frozen chickens, whitebait and pork chops to distribute

as prizes for the next few weeks. Then we'll have a rethink about what the raffle prizes should be. I'm keen on some feedback on this. Would you like fresh meat? How about cash? Wine? The plan is to keep between 50 and 60 percent of the raffle take for club funds - in other words we pay out between \$40 and \$50 in prizes for each raffle.

We're still looking for a Tournament Convenor for the Legends tournament next January. It would be great to have this position filled before the winter. Please contact either Jolanda, Tracey or me if you're keen to get involved in this rewarding role.

REMINDER OF THE <u>DRIVING RANGE</u> RULES OF ENGAGEMENT

- · No hitting when there are golfers adjacent to the driving range on holes 1 and 12.
- No hitting while ball retrieval is being undertaken anywhere, on the range or adjoining areas. The balls must be physically put away to ensure they are not used during the retrieval process.
- Driving Range shall be closed on competition days from the start of competition until the field is underway
- Collecting balls from in front of the mats is prohibited
- All spectators must be behind the mats while people are hitting balls.
- · Range users must hit from the mats only. No hitting from the grass is permitted.
- Driving range balls must be purchased from the proshop BEFORE use.

GOLF CART HIRE RULES OF ENGAGEMENT

If you are hiring a cart, please be aware of all the cart rules displayed on the front windscreen.

This includes:

- The driver must have a valid driver's license.
- Only 2 people per cart.

Players with private carts are expected to follow these rules as well.

Thank you for your cooperation.

- The Hirer accepts that the use of this Golf Cart is entirely at the hirer's risk and Moore Golf will not be liable for any loss or injury sustained by the hirer or any other person resulting from the use of the Golf Cart.
- The Hirer agrees to operate the Golf Cart in a safe manner and adhere to all rules set out by Moore Golf. The hirer of the Golf Cart accepts the following conditions of hire
- The Hirer is at least 18 years of age and assumes all responsibility for anyone operating this Golf Cart.
- Maximum of 2 people and 2 sets of clubs per Golf Cart. Occupants must be seated while the Golf Cart is moving
- Hire is for either 9 or 18 holes and the Golf Cart is to be returned immediately following the round
- The Golf Cart is not to be taken off the Golf course
- The Golf Cart is not to be driven on or unduly close to greens, tee areas or trees.
- The Golf Cart is to stay on cart paths where applicable and not to be driven into the rough beyond the first cut.
- The Golf Cart is not to be driven by any person who is intoxicated
- The Golf Cart is not to be driven in a careless or reckless manner, including no sharp turns, sudden braking, joy riding or disregard of traffic signs.
- Damage caused by negligent use of the Golf Cart is the hirer's responsibility.
- Failure to observe any of the above conditions of hire may result in the immediate cancellation of the Golf Cart hire and forfeiture of the Golf Cart, with no refund of any portion of the Golf Cart hire fee

COURSE HAPPENINGS

Jud says it's good to be back on deck and thanks to all who have helped Mark last week.

Last month's work centred around tidy up for the New Zealand Open qualifying round, mainly cleanup of gum tree debris. And some areas on fairways have been spiked and fertalised as well.

The GUR between #12 & # 15 has been removed - the new trees look great on the new mounds!



There's a mandatory relief from all staked trees to help them establish themselves.

UPCOMING WORK

 Removal of 13 gum trees that are encroaching onto fairways and affecting grass health. This will start 8 April at no cost to the club. We will also remove old marram grass growth next to the #5 tee block.

Follow all instructions of ground marshalls - the course will remain open but play will be paused temporarily when the trees are coming down.

- Tree planting: A total of 43 trees are being planted this autumn; 14 new trees & 5 donated Kowhai trees have been planted in March. The irrigation system for these trees is automated & operational. 8 trees will also be planted along the #18 fairway to block fly balls onto adjacent properties. Temporary irrigation has yet to be finalised for these trees. A further 10 donated Kowhai trees will also be planted in various locations to enhance the course environment.
- A total of 1.5km of irrigation is also planned to be installed in Autumn to irrigation existing trees and for future replacement trees. The following locations have been identified: fairways 4/5, 2/6, 6/7, 7/Gate bdy, 8/ SH bdy, 11/16, and 17/road bdy.
- Fairway repairs will start when the new turf cutter arrives late April and continue as weather permits. The turf nursery has been sown in preparation for this work and we are pleased with the strike rate so far.
