The Australian Digest's Top 50 NZ course rankings are out, and we're excited to be ranked 28th! It's a fantastic achievement among many prestigious courses.

CLUB PRESIDENT• PETER WILLIAMS

Board chairman Bob Scott and myself met with the Central Otago District Council Mayor Tamah Alley and Chief Executive Peter Kelly in late April in order to get some clarification about the lease for the land that some of our golf course is situated on.

As you will be aware, the Club owns freehold the property used for the front nine but the clubhouse, pro shop, carpark and back nine are on land that we lease through the council.

We have a lease on the land till 2044 but there has been some consternation among club members that the so called "Spatial Plan" for Cromwell as part of the "Eye to the Future" suggested that the back nine should be developed into housing - as happened with the former camping ground which is now Prospectors Park bordering the 18th.

However, we have researched the status of the land and found that in 1984 it was designated a Recreation Reserve by the then Minister of Lands and named Golf Park. We lease the land through the Central Otago District Council because they are what is known as the Administering Body.

Under the Reserves Act, a reserve cannot have its classification changed unless approval comes from the Minister, although these days the relevant portfolio is Conservation.

We have legal advice that our lease document states, provided we pay the appropriate rental annually – money we can claim back for club projects anyway – and otherwise fulfill the terms of the lease, then the lease will be renewed in 2044.

The Council officials we met with were unaware of the land's reserve status and while they wish to do their own due diligence on the matter, we have provided them with the New Zealand Gazette notice from 1984 which clarifies the situation in full.



The CEO Mr Kelly did state that while there is pressure on every council in the country to release more land for housing, he did admit that there is a very high bar set to reclassify any reserve land.

Mayor Tamah Alley, who said she enjoyed driving the approach to Cromwell past the golf club, told us that while she couldn't speak for any future councils, there were definitely no plans to have housing on any golf club land in the foreseeable future. She also doubted whether anv elected consider representatives would ever attempting to reclassify reserve land.

Therefore, Bob and I are very confident that we have long term tenure on the leased land beyond 2044 and the Club can therefore make some plans to develop the course and other facilities. The Board has discussed at length what sort of development the Club should undertake, in what order, at what cost and how it should be funded.

But we want to hear the views of you, our members so therefore Club development plans will be a major topic at the Mid-year Member Forum on June 10th at 7pm.

Thanks to the diligent work of previous Boards and the increasing popularity of the course, we have some money in the bank. While we are elected to make decisions, we want to make sure that we have the backing of the Club before pressing ahead.

So, come along to the Mid-year Member Forum and have your voice heared!


