The Club's annual Winter Forum is on Tuesday, June 10 at 7pm.

This is your chance to hear the Board and the Committee outline the Club's current situation, talk about our future plans and give you the chance to put forward your views.

This is not a General Meeting of any sort, so nothing can be moved or passed at this gathering but it is a chance for you to hear about where the Club is at and where the current leadership would like to take it.

Without giving too much away I can say at this time that the Club, thanks to some outstanding financial stewardship from the previous board, is now in a very healthy financial position. We have over \$300,000 in Term Deposits but we are a golf club, not a bank and the current board believes it is time to invest some of that money in facilities for members, visitors and our staff.

At the Winter Forum we will tell you about the current Board's thinking which, without going into too much detail, means putting the bar and the kitchen together in the current kitchen area and adding some space out through the back wall, then removing the current bar to open out the internal space to make it a much larger area across two levels.

We also would like to remove the current Manager's office and Pro Shop buildings and replace them with one structure incorporating both the Pro Shop and office looking out onto the practice green.

With the Club's ability to borrow money rather limited, we have to fund these projects through cashflow and at the moment we are in the healthy position as outlined above and our income, especially from green fees, continues to run ahead of budget. But you will have the chance to comment on these ideas, and other issues about the Club, next Tuesday. Cont...

Even though we are heading towards the depths of winter, we have started making some initial plans for the Club's biggest annual event, the Legends Tournament. As you know, Willie Moore decided to step down as the Tournament Director after this year's event and as there were no takers/volunteers for the position, it seems as if it has fallen to men to lead the team to put the event together. Already Sandy Crofts has provided some fantastic assistance and we will be coopting others as we get nearer the event in early spring. The tournament will be on the third weekend of January in 2026, that is the 17th and 18th on the month.

I sent a survey out to all the teams who played in this year's event and we'll be taking on board the responses to that survey as we plan the 2026 Legends. But what has come through strongly in the responses so far, and 29 of the 60 teams have replied, is that the preference is for the event to continue on the Saturday and Sunday and that your team stays and plays together for both rounds. There is also an appetite for a social event on the Friday night featuring some of the better known Legends playing in the tournament. Our wonderful and very supportive major sponsor of recent years, Jonathan Usher of Z Cromwell (magician extraordinaire), is keen to be involved once again and together we're hoping we can attract more famous names to take part in the event.

There are still issues with safety on the 10th and 18th holes. Many tee shots from the 10th fly over to the 18th endangering players coming up the 18th who of course cannot be seen by those hitting from the 10th. While we have sometimes shifted the white tees back on the 10th and forward on the 18th, there is still a potentially dangerous situation. The Board and the Committee are suggesting a warning system be installed on the 10th tee that would prevent players teeing off till the area is clear. Just how such a system would work is not yet properly determined but it will be some kind of sensor with a red and a green light. We will make it in keeping with the surrounds but the proximity of the two holes and the blind spot made by the mounds between them does present a potentially dangerous scenario which as a Club we have to mitigate as best as possible.

Plan accordingly and choose the platform that works best for your needs!


PENNANTS REPORT by Brett Haugh

In this 2025 season, we have six teams competing across 5 grades with 4 teams already securing a finals spot and the chance to be crowned Central Otago Pennant Champion.

The Central Otago Golf pennant season is coming to the end of the round robin stage with the Senior A and Intermediate divisions completed, leaving the Senior B and Junior A divisions with one round to go.

I'm proud to report the Senior A has qualified for the final. They finished tied first on equal points with Wanaka dropping back to second on count back. I know they will be determined to switch places in the final and place the Pennant Trophy in the cabinet beside the Dewar Cup!

Cromwell has dominated the Intermediate division with both teams qualifying for the final. The Cromwell 1 team lead by Jeff Swale (in the absence of Don Agnew) took top spot with

COURSE MAKEOVER MAGIC! 🛠 🛠



Stump grinding has been completed for the recently removed gums and the root footprint dressed to remove (spread) accumulated gum seed. These areas may need further work in the spring to provide grass cover if they don't recover naturally.



The turf cutter finally arrived and we have started repairing small areas of fairways while the weather remains relatively mild. We also purchased an auger and greenstaff will progressively install vertical drains to address areas where water ponds.

The next improvement work planned is installation of irrigation lines between fairways for future tree replacement.

Ever wonder how we decide where the hole goes each week? Here's a quick look behind the scenes:

Our greens are divided into three zones—front, middle, and back.

We rotate pin placements on a 6-week cycle:

- 2 weeks in the front third
 - 2 weeks in the middle third
- 2 weeks in the back third

This rotation helps spread out wear and tear and keeps the greens in top shape.

When choosing a new spot, we make sure it's:

- 2 to 2.5 meters away from any recent hole
- At least a mower width from the edge of the green
- On healthy turf that's had time to recover

In the lead-up to tournaments, we may adjust placements to protect premium spots for the event.

E Pro Tip: If your ball lands near an old plug hole that hasn't fully healed, you're allowed to take relief without penalty.


And during deep winter, if the ground is frozen solid (permafrost), we might leave the pin in place longer than usual—cutting new holes just isn't possible when the ground's like concrete! In winter, plugged holes take longer to recover, so pin placements can be a bit more of a challenge.

Thanks for playing, and we hope this gives you a better idea of what goes into keeping your greens fair and fun!



As we head into the cooler months, it's more important than ever to repair pitch marks promptly. With firmer greens during winter, unrepaired marks take longer to heal and can affect the smoothness of the putting surface. A quick repair helps maintain the quality of the greens and ensures they continue to roll true for everyone. Please do your part—repair your pitch marks and help keep our greens in top shape this season!
