CLUB PRESIDENT REPORT

The Club's annual Winter Form was a congenial and successful evening on the 10th of June.

Board member Dave Harper was able to report a likely surplus for our financial year ending September 30 of approximately \$180,000. This is a quite astounding result considering the budgeted surplus was less than half this number. As well, the Club has just over \$300,000 on term deposit.

The major driver of this position is a significant increase in green fee income. Till the end of May we'd taken \$237,259 from visitors to the Club. That's nearly \$60,000 ahead of budget for that particular period and actually \$20,000 more than budget for the full financial year. While the winter season sees green fee income reduce, our dry playing conditions still make us an attractive golf course to visit so we expect a steady flow of cash from our visitors for the final three months of the financial year.

But as I have reported before, the time has come to invest that income in better facilities and services for the Club. While we are first and foremost a members' club, we need to offer a better experience before and after golf for our visitors too.

So the Winter Forum was presented with some possibilities to improve the clubhouse and pro shop/administration area.

Essentially, the plan is to install a new building to house the pro shop and manager's office facing the practice green and then change the entrance to the club from its current position to have us walking through the hedge from the car park and across where the practice bunker currently is.

In the clubhouse, the plan is to combine the bar and kitchen in the current kitchen area, extend the back wall of the clubhouse to provide a food preparation and chill store area and then remove the current bar to open up the clubhouse floor space area, albeit on two levels. Cont...

Board chairman Bob Scott has had preliminary meetings with a club member involved in the building industry and moves are underway to get some drawings started.

While we would all like the project to be completed yesterday, and we will be moving with haste, demands on the construction industry in our area mean we will have to be patient to get these jobs done.

The final stage of the project at this stage will be to give the clubhouse a good paint! It's time we said goodbye to the 1970s brown summerhill stone and unpainted concrete blocks!

The mood of the Winter Forum was very supportive of the Board's ideas and we feel that has given us a significant mandate to start making some moves.

That is not to say we are neglecting investment on the course itself. Les Topping presented to the Forum and told us of his Course Committee's plans for the next year which include improving the fairways through the use of a newly acquired turf cutter and

removing many of the old pine trees near the greenkeepers' compound on the right of the 12th hole, and on the right side of the 13th fairway.

Cromwell Golf Club is by some distance the biggest sports club in the Central Otago District and, as those green fee numbers suggest, we are a not insignificant contributor to the local economy. With Cromwell's projected growth and the demand for places to play golf in Queenstown and Wanaka not slowing, our attractiveness as a place to play is not likely to decrease anytime soon so we need to provide the best on and off course facilities possible.

However we may have to indulge your patience as there will no doubt be interruptions to our normal flow of activity while this work is undertaken.

I would like to thank the approximately 70 members who attended the Winter Forum and we thank you for your support of the Board's initiatives.

 Annual General Meeting (AGM) on Monday 24 November at 7pm


WOMEN'S MATCH COMMITTEE


We also need two volunteers for the bar on each day:



Coaching with Greg Overall

COLD AIR, LONG CLUBS, AND SMART ADJUSTMENTS

It's that time of year again—shorter days, brisk air, and that frustrating feeling that the ball just isn't traveling like it used to. Cold weather can seriously affect distance, and it often means pulling a longer club (sometimes even two!) than you normally would.

Most of us tend to come up short of the target rather than overshoot—even on our best days—so winter is the perfect time to make thoughtful adjustments.

If you're using a GPS, consider aiming for the back of the green. Using a laser? Try adding 10–20 metres to your target distance when choosing your club.

And don't ignore what your game is telling you. If your early approach shots are falling short, take more club until you're consistently reaching the target.

Lower scores and more fun are well within reach. Happy golfing, everyone!

While it's been a relatively quiet month on the course, but a few key updates are worth noting:



Tree Work

Two trees have been removed - one near the #14 yellow tee block, and a pine from the left rough of #12 fairway. This has yielded a modest supply of firewood, which has been split and is now available to members.

Branch Trimming

Ongoing trimming of low-hanging branches is underway to improve visibility and playability across several areas.



Topsoil Delivery

A major task this month was the import of 500m³ of high-quality topsoil, now stockpiled along the boundary near the #7 fairway.

This area is clearly marked and should be treated as GUR (Ground Under Repair).



Dunes Boundary Mowing

A big thank you to Tyler and his employer Gary Ford from Vinewise Machinery for tidying up the Dunes boundary - the area is looking much sharper thanks to their efforts!



THELP KEEP THE COURSE LOOKING MINT!

Our greenkeepers do a fantastic job, but keeping the course in top shape is a team effort. Here's how you can help:

- Replace or Sand Your Divots
 - o On fairways: Replace your divots or fill them with sand.
 - On tee blocks: Just sand them no need to replace.
- Always book your tee time ahead and check in with the pro shop on arrival. This helps us keep you updated and allows greenkeepers to schedule maintenance without disrupting your rounnd.
- Repairing Your Pitch Marks is especially important during the cooler months, when grass growth slows down. A quick fix now prevents long-term damage.



Let's all do our part to keep the course looking good this winter - every little action makes a big difference!
